## RECORD PARTICIPATION AT KORTNEY'S CHALLENGE SIGNALS GROWING AWARENESS OF PEDIATRIC BRAIN CANCER



he Kortney Rose Foundation recently announced records for both attendance and funds raised at its 9TH Annual Family Fun Run to support research for pediatric brain cancer, the number one tumor-related cause of death in children under age 19. Kortney's Challenge drew 540 supporters to Monmouth Park raising over \$42,000 that will directly benefit The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's (CHOP) world-class pediatric brain tumor research consortium. The Kortney Rose Foundation presents a check to CHOP annually, with donations-to-date totaling over \$750,000. This year, the portion of the annual donation raised from Kortney's Challenge will be donated in the name of 15 year-old Oceanport resident, **Alex Munoz** (pictured here with **his brothers** during the race). Alex has been battling a brain tumor for over a year, and is being treated at CHOP. His participation, along with friends and family who formed "Team Alex," served as additional inspiration to both runners and the organizers.




