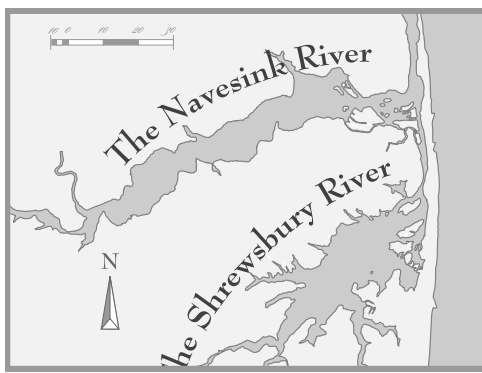

Rumson Boat Race

The Drexel Dragons opened the fall crew season with a sweep in all three races, taking home the Governor's Cup. The Navesink River was the setting for the Rumson Boat Race early Saturday morning that featured men's varsity eight and second varsity eight, women's varsity eight and second varsity eight along with high school crew teams. Boats launched from the beach next to Victory Park and headed up-river to the starting line in Red Bank for the 2,500-meter course, ending short of the Oceanic Bridge on the Middletown side of the river. College clubs competing were Drexel, Rutgers and Villanova and for the high school race, RFH Rowing, Westfield High School and St Joseph of Metuchen.
